# Language and Literacy

# USE OF MOBILE PHONES/PERSONAL MOBILE TECHNOLOGY Education

In line with DE guidance, children are <u>not</u> permitted to use mobile phones at any stage throughout the day on school premises. Any child who brings a phone to school must leave it into reception at the start of the school day and collect it at the end of the day.

Children are strongly discouraged from bringing their personal mobile technology to school, including hand-held gaming devices and smart watches, due to safeguarding concerns and the high cost of such devices.

#### Parents are asked to support our approach by:

- Postponing giving your child a phone
- Only allowing your child to bring a phone to school if absolutely necessary
- Discussing appropriate and safe use of phones

- We encourage full sentences where appropriate (comprehensions and weekly sentences) and the children are asked to show their working out to maths questions, so areas for development can be highlighted.
- Please keep the teacher informed of any concerns/difficulties.

#### Study Ladder and LBQ

- -Online homeworks
- -Study Ladder- pods are set up weekly and children can complete 3 more of their choosing.
- -LBQ can only be completed on the night and closes at 10pm







#### Medication

All medication must be delivered to the Principal, or authorised person, in a secure and labelled container as originally dispensed.

Each item of medication must be clearly labelled with the following information:

- Pupil's name
- Name of medication
- Dosage
- Frequency of administration

- Date of dispensing
- Storage requirements (if important)
- Expiry date

The school will not accept items of medication in unlabelled containers.

Medication for long term medical needs will be kept safely in the classroom in clearly labelled medical bags/ containers supplied by the parents/ carers.

Short term medication/ antibiotics: It is preferred that medication is given at home as we cannot guarantee timings or consistency of administration.

#### FOR YOUR OWN INFORMATION

If children refuse to take medicines, staff will not force them to do so, and will inform the parents/ carers of the refusal on the same day.

It is the responsibility of parents/ carers to notify the school in writing if the pupil's need for medication has ceased.

If is the parents'/carers' responsibility to renew medication when supplies are running low and to ensure that the medication supplied is within its expiry date.

The school will not make changes to dosages on parental instructions alone.

School staff will not dispose of medicines. Medicines will be returned to parents for transfer to a community pharmacist for safe disposal.

For each pupil with long term or complex medication needs, a Medication Plan is drawn up by appropriate health professionals and shared with the parents and school.

Where appropriate, pupils will be encouraged to administer their own medication, if necessary under staff supervision. Parents/ carers will confirm in writing if they wish their child to carry their long term medication with them in school e.g. asthma

# Healthy Eating

#### Healthy Eating Policy:

To encourage healthy eating habits through the consumption of fruit and veg. at break-time and secondly in consideration for children with severe allergic reaction.

- Still water (in a plastic bottle) is allowed for drinking in moderation during class
- Discourage crisps, no fizzy drinks
- No nuts of any sort are permitted in school

Dinners - £2.60 to be sent in an envelope. Dinner menu is on the school website.

Please inform teacher of any new allergies and to also check if current medication in office is up to date.

We encourage that the children are well rested and ready for school.

Importance of good punctuality (8.55am)/ attendance.

-Remember to please inform the school via Dojo or a phone call if your child is absent and the reason provided to help with registration

- Prepared for the school day: pencil, rubber, sharpener, whiteboard marker, colouring pencils, scissors and glue. Please label and replenish when needed.
- Prompt return of permission slips throughout the year (must be signed)
- Uniforms- appropriate coats and uniform labelled
- Designated teacher for Child Protection (Mr Coyle and Miss Acum-deputy)

Teachers will not respond to individual messages this year due to time constraints.
