FAMILIES CONNECT PROGRAMME

Families Connect is a six-week programme taking place on Thur mornings starting on Feb 19th2026, aimed at parents of P1 and P2 pupils. Each workshop lasts 2 hours and focuses on language, literacy, mathematics, numeracy as well as social & emotional development. The sessions, delivered by Ms Dorman and Mrs McDaniel, are informal, relaxed and hugely beneficial to your child's learning. PARENT CARER SURVEY 2024/25

During the last school year we surveyed parents/carers about our emotional health and wellbeing provision in the first term and on a wider range of issues later in the year. A summary of the last survey is available here. The amount of homework set was an issue for a significant number of parents/carers with 40% saying too much was given, 59% saying it was just about right and 1% saying too little was given. We will survey parents again during parent teacher consultations to see if this is an issue across all-year groups. Any parent who feels that their child is getting too much homework should prioritise reading and then do whatever is feasible for the child.

FAMILY SUPPORT HUBS

Being a parent can be very rewarding but can also be very challenging. Occasionally it's hard to know where to turn to for support. The local Family Support Hubs (FSH) bring together community, statutory and voluntary organisations. Each Hub has a Co-ordinator who has a deep knowledge of local support services and will connect families with the most appropriate supports. A FSH leaflet is available on our website here.
