We have continued to operate with reduced staffing over the past month due to Covid and it remains very difficult to get substitute teachers. All of the staff have continued to work very flexibly and with great commitment to ensure that we have not had to ask individual classes to remain at home for their safety. We hope that we are over the worst of the pandemic at this stage, although new cases are still being reported amongst children and staff.

We ask that parents/carers continue to exercise a cautious approach if children experience any coughs/ colds/minor illness/raised temperatures and test for Covid before sending them to school.

If your child is absent from school, please let the class teacher know so that the absence is recorded accurately. If they are well enough to do some work, a work pack can be provided by asking the class teacher. The EA School Meals Service can also provide a food pack on request.

ONLINE SAFETY

DE has partnered with INEQE Safeguarding Group to provide the award winning Safer Schools App to support parents/ carers to keep children safe online. **Safer Schools NI App** will help you navigate the digital world that children live in every day, giving you the tools to protect your child. Search for 'Safer Schools NI' in the App/Play Store. Follow the instructions to register and create an account, select our school and input 2030 when asked for a code.

We have noticed recently that some older children have Whatsapp/Snapchat on their phones. These apps are not designed for use by primary school children and frequently cause friendship difficulties through inappropriate use. We ask that if parents permit children to download these apps, their use is carefully monitored.

SCHOOL SAFETY

Parents are asked not to drive into the school grounds, with the exception of blue badge holders. Please park with care and consideration and be careful not to block gateways, drives and footpaths. Please be especially vigilant when reversing.

No dogs are allowed on the school grounds, other than assistance/ guide dogs. We also ask that dogs are not left unattended outside of the school while you collect your child, in case they are frightened if approached by excited children.

Please note, to keep the children safe, **small studs** are the only type of earring suitable for wearing in school. Earrings must be removed for PE lessons. If earrings cannot be removed it is possible "to make them safe by taping, front and back, which may offer a measure of protection. Taping should be sufficient to prevent the stud post penetrating the bone behind the ear". AFPE 2017

The Breakfast Club is open from 8am. No children should be on the school grounds before this. Children not using the Breakfast Club can arrive from 8.45am.

ATTENDANCE AND PUNCTUALITY

Regular school attendance is hugely important for learning and emotional wellbeing. Our pupils' attendance is usually very good. Unfortunately, due to Covid many children have had broken attendance this year. Hopefully, as the pandemic is coming to an end, we will have less illness in the community over the next few months and attendance will improve again! It is also very important that the children arrive punctually in the mornings. The first part of the morning is spent consolidating learning from previous days so children who are frequently late miss these opportunities.
